



In August of 1861, the fire department purchased their first engine from the San Francisco Fire Department. The hand pulled unit was too much for the hills of the city and much better suited for the flat lands of Suisun City.

SEVERAL FIRES HAVE DEVASTATED THE DOWNTOWN AREA OF SUISUN CITY

FEBRUARY 4TH, 1869 – A FIRE BROKE OUT IN MEHAN'S SHOE SHOP, WEST OF THE CITY **SQUARE (WHERE 700 MAIN ST. CURRENTLY STANDS). THE FIRE SPREAD IN BOTH DIRECTIONS** TAKING WITH IT ALMOST ALL OF THE BUILDINGS ON THE WEST SIDE OF MAIN ST. THE ONLY **BUILDING LEFT STANDING WAS A** FIREPROOF BRICK BUILDING WHICH HOUSED REEVES & CO.

FIRE AT BUISUN, A dispatch dated at Suisun, February 4th, says:

About a quarter past three o'clock this morning a fire broke out in Mehan's shoe shop, on Main street. It spread both ways, and burned all the buildings on the west side of the street, on the square, excepting Reeves & Co.'s fire-proof brick store. The following buildings were deptroyed: Turner's millinery shop; Mrs. Perce's millinery shop, Etc., et's harber shop. Pacific House, Remner's barber shop, Stewards restaurant, Mahan's shoe shop, Reardon's saddle store, Miller's bakery, Mrs. Heinstadt's millinery store and Reym's vegetable depot. The total loss in buildings and merchandise is \$20,000; about \$6,000 insurance. The fire was subdued by the fire company and other citizens at five o'clock.

DISASTROUS FIRE.


Entire Business Portion of Suisun Laid in Ashes.

Brutal Murder of a Deputy Sheriff and Escape of Prisoners.

An Oregon Hunter Accidentally Shoots His Companion in the Head—Sad Death of a Portland Girl.

Suisun, July 9th .- To-day at 2:30 P. M. a fire was discovered in the shed back of the residence of W. T. Bartlett on Suisun street, and as a strong westerly wind was blowing it was soon communicated to the adjoining buildings. The fire company was on the ground promptly, but its efforts were unavailing, and in less than a half hour all the adjoining buildings were in flames and the houses across the street were smoking. The wind soon communicated the fire across the street to the Postoffice, and to the warehouses at the back of the stores on Main street, as well as across Solano street to the north. The fire raged furiously and entered the brick stores through the windows or through the roof, completely demolishing all of them upon the two main busness blocks of the town. But a small quantity of goods were taken from the stores, and most of that which was taken out was afterwards burned. There were eight blocks destroyed. bounded by Washington street on the west, the slough on the east, California street on the south and Sacramento street on the north, except on Main street, where the fire extended a block on the west side street. At least seven-eights of the property in the town was destroyed, as all the stores had just recently laid in a large supply of stock for the Summer. Late in the after-

8 square blocks were lost when a fire fueled by the Westwind broke out in a Shed. The map below shows the approximate area.

A Grass Roots Effort To Build Suisun City's 2nd Fire Station

The walls of Sulsun City's second fire station are expected to rise within two months. Suisan Fire Chief Jim Permington said.

VACAVILLE, CALIFORNIA. FR1., SEPT. 19, 1980

Located at the intersection of Pintail Way and East Widgean Drive in Suisum, the station will serve the newlydeveloped areas of the offy.

Pennington described the project as a "community salf-help" program which featured — and still features — stonations and contributions from the public.

The 5,000-square foot station will

accommodate aix engines. The concrete foundation has been in place and Hoffman Co. contractors were bosy finishing paving.

Pennington said equipment will be stored at the new station once the external structure is complete, but work will have to continue on internal fixtures, including flooring, paint and electrical wiring.

The fire chief said volunteer firefighters and Suisun City citizens have been working together for two years to gather support for the new station


